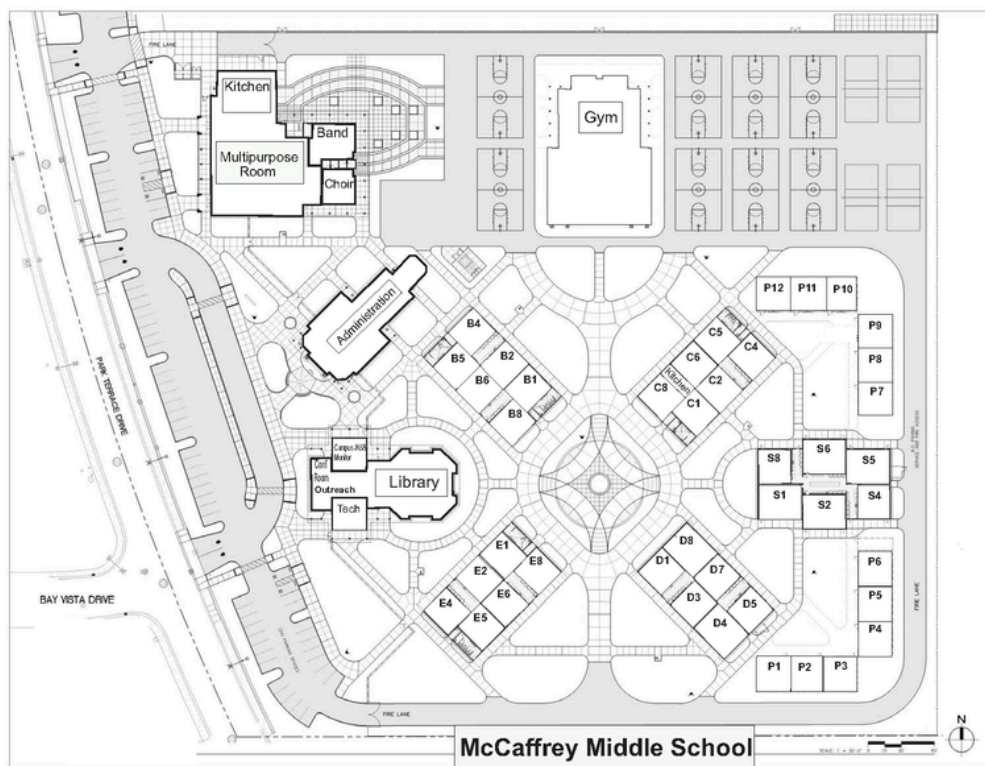

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

McCaffrey Middle School will not tolerate any comments or gestures which are vulgar or obscene or which discriminate against others on account of sex, race, ethnicity, sexual orientation, religion, ancestry, national origin, handicap, or disadvantage. Students shall be subject to disciplinary procedures for bullying other students or for using insults, slurs, or fighting words that may disrupt school activities.

Students will be held accountable for following school rules and should be aware that not understanding a rule or not knowing about it is not an acceptable excuse for misbehavior. If you do not understand any of the school rules or have questions about them, you should make an appointment with an administrator.

CELL PHONES:

All Cell Phones must be turned OFF (not on silent or vibrate) as soon as you cross the front gates. Cell phones may be turned back on after dismissal. Cell phones are NOT to be on or out during any part of the instructional school day, including passing times and lunch. Cell phones cannot be in pocket or visible. Cell phones must be in students' backpacks. All cell phones will be taken away from students if they have them out, are using them on campus, or if the phone rings in class. The school is not responsible for lost or stolen cell phones.

If a cell phone is confiscated from a student, they can pick it up in the office after school. If a cell phone is confiscated a second time, a parent will be requested to come to school to get the phone. Third and Fourth Violations, student will be referred to the administration, and an appropriate disciplinary consequence will be issued. Fifth Violation, the student will be placed on the No Activities List and will receive appropriate disciplinary consequences for the remainder of the trimester.

Video Recording & Photography

Video recording and/or taking pictures with a cell phone or any other device are not permitted while on school campus and/or at school-sponsored activities and events. Students who violate this policy will be subject to school consequences.

Student Handbook Policy – Sexting

Sexting, which includes sending, receiving, or distributing sexually explicit messages, images, or videos via electronic devices, is strictly prohibited. Any student involved in sexting will face disciplinary consequences and may be reported to law enforcement as required by law.

Inappropriate Content Sharing

Sharing or distributing inappropriate pictures or videos of a sexual nature is strictly prohibited. Students who engage in this behavior will face school consequences and may be reported to local law enforcement.

At McCaffrey Middle School, all students are expected to adhere to the following basic school rules:

Be Nice - Be Safe - Be Responsible

The following general types of behavior are not acceptable at McCaffrey Middle School and may result in a STEP on our CDP discipline system, loss of privileges, lunch detention, suspension, or expulsion:

- Bringing a toy gun or replica of a gun to school
- Bullying; repeated actions with the intent to scare others
- Causing, attempting to cause, or threatening to cause physical injury to another person
- Posting inappropriate pictures, and comments on social media
- Disrupting classes, students, and teachers
- Racial slurs of any kind
- Failure to report to detention
- Failure to follow directions
- Fighting, encouraging students to fight, watching fights, video-taping fights, posting fights online
- Explosives/Flammable materials (Firecracker, stink bomb/spray)
- Hand-holding, kissing, and hugging – no PDA
- Leaving campus without a pass
- Possessing a dangerous object
- Possessing, using, selling, or being under the influence of a controlled substance or alcoholic beverage
- Sexual harassment
- Smoking
- Spreading rumors
- Stealing
- Tagging, gang-related activities
- Tardies to school or between classes
- Taunting or teasing with the intent to hurt or embarrass others
- Threats and intimidation
- Throwing food or littering on campus
- Throwing or shooting objects -harmful to school property or another student or staff member
- Truancies
- Unnecessary physical contact such as shoving, kicking, horseplay
- Vandalism
- Vulgar gestures
- Weapons of any kind
- Willfully using force or violence on another person
- No Gum

BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS Cont...

Fighting consequences:

- 1st fight will receive a 1-3 day suspension
- 2nd fight will receive a 3-5 day suspension, SARB letter, and possible recommendation for expulsion
- 3rd fight will receive a 5-day suspension, a SARB hearing, and a recommendation for expulsion

Any type of behavior that causes a disruption to school activities or defies the valid authority of school personnel engaged in the performance of their duties is subject to suspension and/or expulsion.

The school administration may at any time place a student on suspension or expulsion if it is determined that such action best serves the interest of the student(s) and/or the school.

Students engaging in unacceptable behavior may be placed in an alternative setting when the school administration considers it an appropriate alternative. Students displaying unacceptable behavior in the alternative setting may be suspended.

School authorities have the legal right and the responsibility to search any student when/if they have reason to believe the student is in possession of drugs, alcohol, vape/tobacco, weapons, items belonging to someone else, or anything else that is inappropriate for a safe school setting. If any such items are found it is the responsibility for school authorities to seize the item. (Penal Code 62610) The school may also enlist the services of law enforcement to search for illegal substances.

Mandatory Recommendation for Expulsion (EC 48915-c) - The principal must suspend and recommend expulsion for (1) possessing, selling or otherwise furnishing a firearm, (2) brandishing a knife at another person, (3) unlawfully selling a controlled substance, and (4) sexual assault or sexual battery.

An expulsion recommendation is required (EC 48915) (a) and (b) for (1) causing serious physical injury, (2) possession of any knife, explosive or other dangerous object, (3) unlawful possession of any controlled substance such as listed in Chapter 2 of the Health and Safety Code, and (4) robbery or extortion.

Students who have accumulated a total of 20 days of suspension in one school year will be recommended for expulsion. Any student who has been expelled during the school year will not be allowed to participate in any of the end-of-the-year activities.

Students will be held accountable for their behavior to and from school, as well as during school hours and school-sponsored events.

STRIKE SYSTEM:

Students who receive a suspension (in-house or at home) will also receive a 'strike.' Students who receive "strikes" during the school year are at risk of not being able to participate in any of the end-of-the-year activities (field day, class trip, dance, promotion, etc.). 8th graders with two strikes may participate in promotion and may appeal to participate in one additional activity. Students with three or more strikes may appeal to receive promotion. 7th graders with three or more strikes will lose end-of-year activities.

DRESS CODE POLICY

Failure to follow the district's approved dress code will result in the following progressive consequences:

1. First Violation
 - a. Student will receive a verbal warning and a written notification.
2. Second Violation
 - a. Student will receive a second notification, and their parents/guardians will be contacted.
3. Third and Fourth Violations
 - a. Student will be referred to administration, and an appropriate disciplinary consequence will be issued.
4. Fifth Violation
 - a. Student will be placed on the No Activities List for the remainder of the trimester.

At the beginning of each new trimester, all students will start fresh, and previous dress code violations will not carry over.

DRESS CODE

The administration is aware of the changing nature of style in student dress. We seek to balance current style with a dress code that allows for full physical participation in school activities and does not otherwise distract from or degrade the educational atmosphere of the school.

Dress Code Cont...

Due to the highly changeable nature of gang-associated clothing, the administration reserves the right to declare any clothing, accessories, colors of specific items of clothing, signs, and graffiti which has been identified as associated with gangs, as off-limits on the school premises.

Dresses, Skirts, Shorts

- All must hit the tips of the child's fingertips. If the dresses, skirts, shorts, ride up above the fingertips, the student will NOT be allowed to contact an adult for a change of clothing; students will be asked to change into clothes provided by the office staff for the rest of the school day.

Pants

- Sagging or excessively baggy pants are inappropriate and not permitted.
- Pants must be worn at the waist and a belt must be worn if one is necessary to keep the pants from sagging. Sweat pants should have a drawn string and should be worn at the waist.
- Pants and bib overalls are to be properly fastened.
- Distressed jeans with holes above the child's fingertips are not allowed. No skin showing. Leggings can be worn under the jeans so that skin does not show.

Belts:

- No dangling belts (also includes chains linked to belts).
- No initial belt buckles.

Shoes:

- Shoes must be worn at all times and must have a rubber sole.
- House shoes (i.e. house slippers are not allowed)
- Lace-up athletic shoes are best.
- If backless shoes are worn, students must bring an extra pair of shoes suitable for PE.

Tops:

- Must cover the upper body during normal activity.
- Undergarments should not show including the view from the back.
- No low cut, halter tops, midriffs, sheer/see-through, spaghetti straps, razorback, tank tops, tube tops, or muscle shirts are not allowed. Tops should have sleeves.

Jewelry:

- No spike or sharp earrings (cones/gauges), necklaces, bracelets, or chains allowed.
- No red or blue crosses or rosaries.
- Face piercing is highly discouraged; if it becomes a distraction in class, the student will be asked to remove piercings.
- Necklaces with bullet shells/ammunition are not allowed.
- No lanyards or chains hanging out of pocket.

Hats/Beanies:

- The wearing of hats is permitted on school grounds as long as they are worn properly. Hats must be taken off when entering a building except in the multipurpose room during lunch. Five school-wide violations will result in loss of hat privileges for 30 days.

Bandanas:

- Are not to be worn or displayed on backpacks or clothing.

Pajamas/Slippers/Blankets:

- Are not appropriate for school wear.

General:

Any clothing, jewelry, accessories, notebooks, pins, posters, or other items which symbolize recognized groups whose practices intimidate, disrupt activities, or incite the social population are disruptive to school operations and the educational process, and will not be allowed at school. Clothing, jewelry, and body markings must be free of writing, pictures, or any insignia which are crude, vulgar, profane, sexually suggestive, or which advocate racial, ethnic, or religious prejudice, or the use of drugs, alcohol, or vape/tobacco.

Dress Code Cont...

The “eight ball” and “smile now, cry later” symbols are not allowed. “Area Code” numbers are not allowed at school. Any clothing that has been identified by the school and/or Galt PD as gang-related is not allowed.

Note: The administration has the discretion to ban any clothing that may be disruptive to school. Students will NOT be allowed to contact an adult for a change of clothing; students will be asked to change into clothes provided by the office staff for the rest of the school day

ELECTRONIC DEVICES ON CAMPUS

Personal computers and iPads are not allowed to be used on campus. Students must use the school Chromebook that is checked out to them. Chromebooks have all of the applications students will need to use in classes already installed.

To eliminate the distraction caused by electronic devices and to avoid problems of broken, lost, or stolen property, students are advised that they are not to bring iPods, PSPs, handheld video games, and other electronic devices to school. If any items are confiscated, parents will be required to pick up the items in the office.

Earphones/headphones are not to be hanging from the neck. AirPods should not be in ears. Taking pictures with any device on the school campus including the classroom, locker room and restrooms is prohibited and could result in a suspension. Recording any activity without the consent of the student/adult involved can result in a suspension.

CITIZENSHIP DEVELOPMENT PLAN

McCaffrey Middle School's Citizenship Development Plan (CDP) is designed to promote responsible student behavior. The CDP outlines consequences for classroom misbehaviors and provides information for both students and parents regarding the status of disciplinary actions.

Any student is subject to disciplinary actions (per administration) under Education Code 48900 and 48915. This may result in a suspension that is separate from the CDP or a variation of the consequence as outlined in the CDP.

Citizenship Development Plan McCaffrey Middle School All NON-STEP incidents must be logged in Synergy>Teacher's Notes

Step 1: Teacher has conferenced privately with the student about their behavior and has contacted the parent. Teacher logs the incident in Synergy>Incident Referral. Under description type “STEP 1” and describes the incident. Grade-level detention issued by the office.

Step 2: Teacher has conferenced privately with the student about their behavior and has contacted the parent. Teacher logs the incident in Synergy>Incident Referral. Under description type “STEP 2” and describes the incident. Grade-level detention issued by the office.

Step 3.... Student sent to an alternative setting during class to discuss behavior concerns. Teacher logs the incident in Synergy>Incident Referral labeled “STEP 3”. A Disciplinary Action form may be developed at this time. If developed, the form will be signed by the student and emailed to the parent and teachers by a counselor or administrator.

ADMINISTRATION HANDLES CONSEQUENCES FOR STEP 4 AND BEYOND

Step 4.... Student sent to the alternative setting during class to discuss behavior concerns. A Disciplinary Action form will be developed at this time and emailed to the parent and teachers. An SST may be set up to review behavior concerns. Counselors will set up the SST and invite teachers.

Step 5.... Student sent to the Office and the consequences are determined by the administration & parent contact is made stating the next **Step** may result in a suspension.

Step 6.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “2-3 Day In-School or At-Home Suspension or Restorative Practice Interventions as determined by the administrator.

- Student is ineligible to participate in all school activities for 6 school weeks (30 school days).

Step 7.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “2-3” Day In-School or At-Home Suspension or Restorative Practice Interventions as determined by the administrator.

- Student is ineligible to participate in all school activities for 12 school weeks (60 school days).
- “1st” SARB letter sent home for behavior.

Administration handles consequences for step 4 and beyond Cont...

Step 8.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “3-4” Day In-School or At-Home Suspension.

- Student is ineligible to participate in all school activities for the remainder of the school year.
- “2nd” SARB letter sent home for behavior.

Step 9.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “4-5” Days of At-Home Suspension

- “3rd” SARB letter sent home for behavior and referral to SARB.

Step 10.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “5” Days of At-Home Suspension

Step 11.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “5” Days of At-Home Suspension

Recommendation for expulsion if the student has accumulated 20 days of suspension

Step 12.... (THIS IS A STRIKE) “5” Days of At-Home Suspension

Recommendation for expulsion if the student has accumulated 20 days of suspension

ATTENDANCE

Regular attendance is the responsibility and obligation of each and every student enrolled at McCaffrey Middle School.

Whenever it is necessary for a student to be absent, the parent or legal guardian must call the school at 745-5462 ext. 1311 on the day the student is absent. Please provide the following information when calling:

✓ Name of student ✓ Date of absence ✓ Reason for absence

If you are unable to contact the school on the day of your child’s absence, please send a note to the school the next day with the information listed above.

By law, only illness, bereavement, medical/dental appointment, quarantine, and recognized religious holidays/observances are considered excused absences. Out-of-town trips, vacations during instructional days, and ‘personal necessities’ are unexcused absences, regardless of whether the student presents a written excuse. Three unexcused absences will trigger a SARB letter and/or attendance contract.

Truancy: Section 48260 of the California Education Code states:

Any pupil...absent from school without a valid excuse three full days in one school year or tardy or absent for more than one 30-minute period during the school day without a valid excuse on three occasions in one school year, or any combination thereof, is a truant and shall be reported to the attendance supervisor or the superintendent of the school district.

For early check-out, the adult checking out the student must be listed on the emergency card. **All adults must show ID and must have a valid driver’s license.** Please make sure the child exits through the office during check-out. Instructional time is important; we will wait until the adult is present in the office before calling a student out of class.

If you are late to school in the morning, you must report to the office with your student ID and get a pass to class. Lunch detention will be assigned on the third tardy to school or class. Students who accumulate 10 unexcused tardies to school or to class per trimester can be referred to SARB.

Tardy Attendance:

Students with tardies are assigned lunch detention. Students who consistently choose to be late and who have been issued lunch detentions in the past could face a suspension or be referred to SARB.

INDEPENDENT STUDY (I.S.)

Parents of students absent for 3 days or more may apply for Independent Study by doing the following:

- Apply for I.S. form at least 10 school days before date needed.
- The student will then return the completed I.S. application to the office. The STUDENT is responsible for getting the work from the teachers before the contract date starts.
- All schoolwork must be completed and returned to the office per the contract date regardless if the student is absent. Teachers grade the work for credit.
- If I.S. work is not completed, the absences will be recorded as trancies and the student may be referred to SARB.

ELIGIBILITY FOR SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

To be eligible for the end-of-the-year promotion and activities, as well as other extra-curricular events throughout the school year, students must demonstrate appropriate academic and behavioral standards. Students who fall below these standards will be placed on restriction as follows:

ACADEMIC RESTRICTION:

Students who fall below a 2.0 GPA will receive a strike for that trimester. If a student accumulates three strikes (academic and/or behavior) they will lose all end-of-the-year activities, including field day/promotion ceremony. See “Strike System” below.

BEHAVIORAL RESTRICTION:

Upon receiving a first suspension during one year, the student will be restricted for a 6-week (30 school days) period from all school activities beginning with the date of the first suspension. If the suspension occurs during the last 30 school days, 7th & 8th grade students will be restricted from most and/or all of the end-of-the-year activities, including 8th grade promotion. Upon receiving a third suspension, the student will be restricted from all extra-curricular activities for the remainder of the school year. Each suspension will be considered a strike against participation in the end-of-the-year activities (Each suspension = 1 strike). 7th-grade students who receive a suspension within the last 10 days of school will start their 8th-grade year with a strike (determined at the discretion of the administration).

PROMOTION CEREMONY & END OF YEAR ACTIVITIES FOR 8TH GRADERS

Suspensions are considered “strikes” against students. Students with 3 strikes may not participate in the end-of-the-year activities. However, students may submit an appeal to participate in promotion only. Eighth-grade students with 2 strikes are eligible to participate in promotion and may appeal for 1 end-of-the-year activity. If a student receives their first suspension (strike) within 30 school days before the end of the school year, the school administration has the discretion to allow him or her to appeal for the opportunity to participate in promotion only.

RESTRICTION APPEAL PROCEDURE FOR 8TH GRADE PROMOTION & END OF THE YEAR ACTIVITIES

The appeal process is open to 8th-grade students who have received 2 or more strikes based on suspensions and/or academics. The appeal process is also open to students who receive their first suspension (strike) within 30 school days before the end of the school year. School administration has the discretion to allow the student to appeal for the opportunity to participate in promotion only.

Steps to Appeal:

1. **Submit the appeal request letter by the deadline:** Students must submit their appeal request no later than the date provided by administration.
2. **Fill out the Google Form:** Students will need to fill out and submit the Google Form.
3. **Meeting with the counseling department and administration:** The counseling department and administration will meet with the students who submitted an appeal.
4. **Agree to a contract:** Students whose appeals are being considered will be required to sign a contract that outlines the school rules and academic standards they must adhere to if they are granted promotion and/or allowed to participate in the end-of-the-year activity.
5. **Understand that an appeal does not guarantee promotion and/or an end of the year activity:** Submitting an appeal request does not guarantee that a student will be able to participate in promotion or be able to participate in an end-of-the-year activity.
6. **The administration will make the final decision:** The administration will seek the input of teachers, but the final decision will be made by the administration.

It is important for students to understand the appeal process and to provide any relevant supporting evidence. They should also be prepared for the possibility that their appeal may not be approved.

MISCELLANEOUS ITEMS

FOOD SERVICE

Breakfast and lunch are served at McCaffrey Middle School to all students FREE of charge. Students are allowed to sit anywhere they choose in the multipurpose room. All students must remain seated until a staff member dismisses their table. Students will not be dismissed if their area is not clean. Food outside the multipurpose area is not allowed. Water is the only drink allowed inside any building. Starbucks, Dutch, Energy, and soft drinks are not allowed in classrooms. Students will be asked to finish or dump their drink before the start of class. Please avoid dropping off food or drinks to your student during the school day as it causes a disruption. Students will not be notified of these drop-offs.

HEALTH SERVICES

Screenings:

- Vision and hearing screenings are given to all 8th Grade and Special Ed. students. Teachers and/or parents may request either screening at any time.

Medications:

- Students are NOT allowed to have any over-the-counter medications or any prescription medication with them while on campus, without the proper paperwork. Authorization form must be on file and updated every school year.
- No over-the-counter medications can be administered by MMS staff to any student.

PE UNIFORMS

All students are expected to dress for PE. McCaffrey PE uniforms can be bought for the following prices:

Shorts- \$10 ~ Shirt- \$10 ~ Sweatshirt- \$15 ~ Sweatpants- \$15

Checks can be made payable to McCaffrey Middle School (MMS)

STUDENT BODY CARD

Student body cards are provided free to all students (replacement cards are \$5). Student body cards will be required for entry into school events (i.e. sports events, dances, and other school-sponsored activities), purchasing items from the Student Store, late arrival to school, checking out materials from the library, and borrowing loaner P.E. clothing. Students must carry student ID cards at all times when on campus for school business and/or identification.

HOMEWORK POLICY

Up to 90 minutes per night of assigned homework, plus 20-30 minutes of reading. All students are expected to do their homework on a daily basis. Not doing the assigned homework will affect effort scores.

PROGRESS REPORTS

Parents may monitor their student's progress by logging on the school's "ParentVUE"- see our website or call our office for more information.

BULLDOG SCHOLARS

Bulldog Scholar levels will be based on the following GPA criteria each trimester:

If a student does NOT make their AR Goal they will drop a Renaissance Level.

If a student receives an "N" for citizenship they do not qualify for Renaissance.

VAPE/TOBACCO-FREE SCHOOLS

The Board prohibits the use of tobacco products (as well as e-cigarettes) at all times on district grounds. This prohibition applies to all employees, students, visitors and other persons at any activity or athletic event on property owned, leased or rented by or from the district. Students who chose to bring items containing nicotine could face a suspension.

TOXIC ITEMS

Items that are toxic to students (such as permanent markers, white out) are not allowed at school.

VISITORS

All visitors must sign in at the office. Visitors will be given a visitor badge that must be worn at all times while on campus.

McCaffrey Middle School's Honesty Policy

A BULLDOG STUDENT WILL BE NICE, BE SAFE, & BE RESPONSIBLE.
As such, a Bulldog student will not cheat.

Cheating is the unauthorized use of information, materials, devices, sources or practices.

Examples include, but are not limited to:

- Copying or looking at someone else's work (including print and online sources) and turning it in as your own (including rearranging words from someone else's work)
- Allowing someone to copy your work.
- Giving/showing someone else the answers
- Having someone else do your work for you (Friends, Family, Tutors, etc.)
- Using someone else's ideas without proper citation

Performance Assessments

If a student is caught cheating on any type of performance assessment, **ALL** students involved will receive the following consequences:

- Test score will be recorded as an F
- A Step on the Citizenship Development Plan
- Phone call or Email home

If a student is caught cheating on a performance assessment for a second time they will also not be able to qualify for Renaissance that trimester.

Effort Assignments

If a student is caught cheating on an effort assignment, **ALL** students involved will receive the following consequences:

- A Step on the Citizenship Development Plan
- Phone call or email home
- "0" on Effort for that assignment

If a student is caught cheating on an effort assignment for a second time, they will also not be able to qualify for Renaissance that trimester.

*Consequences start over each trimester.

McCaffrey Athletic Team Policy

At McCaffrey we understand the importance of athletic competition for our students. Participating in school sports is considered a privilege, and we feel the necessity to set a high standard for our student athletes. Here are the following guidelines for participating in athletics:

1. Students must have a 2.0 GPA on a 4.0 grade scale in all enrolled classes in order to participate/remain on a McCaffrey athletic team.
2. A player cannot have any N's in citizenship on their most recent middle school gradebook report (report card).
3. A teacher assigned class suspension will result in the player being removed from the team for 5 school days.
4. An athlete suspended from school will be suspended from the team for 4 games. Following the suspension, the athlete may return to full activity. Any further behavior violations during the season will result in the athlete being removed from the team.
5. Athletes may not have more than 3 logged incidents (poor behavior, tardies, PE non-suits, steps, suspensions, etc.). to participate in tryouts and/or participate on a school team. If a player should go past 3 written incidents at any time during the school year, they may be immediately dismissed from the team.
6. School Attendance Requirements: Student athletes must attend 50% or a majority of class periods in a school day in order to be eligible to participate in practice or a contest that same day. School activities will not count as absences.
7. Athletes may not have more than 1 unexcused absence from practice or games. More than 1 unexcused absence will result in removal from the team. Unexcused absence means that the coach was not notified prior to the absence. If the player must be absent, they are responsible for notifying the coach ahead of time.
8. If a player participates in athletic activities outside school, the school sport must come first. If an athlete misses either a game or practice due to a conflict with an outside athletic activity, they will be removed from the team.
9. If an athlete misses practice for any reason, they will not start the next game. This does not mean they will not play.
10. Athletes are not guaranteed playing time. Some athletes will play more than others. These decisions are entirely at the coaches' discretion, and coaches are under no obligation to explain their decisions. The coaches at McCaffrey Middle School truly enjoys working with young people and sharing their love of athletics and athletic competition. It is virtually impossible to satisfy every parent and player, and it is to be expected that not everyone will agree with the coaches' decisions throughout the course of the season. However, in the end, the final decision is to be the coaches' and parental input will not be accepted.
